




## **SUMMER TRAVEL**

Car & Air Travel Safety and Preparedness Tips\*

#### **FOR CAR RIDES**

#### ■ Buckle up!

Harness your pets anytime they're in a car.

#### Ease them into it

Try getting your pet used to long distances with short rides little by little.

#### Bring supplies

Bring bowls, leashes, toys, a crate, grooming equipment or any medicines that might be needed along the way.

#### Travel on an empty stomach

Don't feed your pet near departure time. Dogs tend to get sick at the start of the trip while they adjust to movement.

#### 5 Find pet friendly hotels

Many hotels allow animals under certain guidelines. They may charge a fee between \$10 to \$50 per pet.

#### **FOR AIRPLANE RIDES**

#### Know your pet

Medical conditions, breed, age, or temperament can affect the way your pet deals with air travel.

#### 2 It's all about research

Understand specific airline rules and regulations, and what documents are required. Visit your veterinarian and obtain a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection along with a passport for your pet for overseas travel.

#### Plan in advance

Make early flight reservations, book non-stop flights, consider the temperature, get your pet used to travel carriers and busy places, like airports.

#### Time to fly

Have a checklist that includes taking your dog on a long walk, having them on an empty (or nearly empty) stomach, checking their collars and ID tags, let crew members know that your pet is flying, pack a bag with supplies, and try to avoid sedatives.

# HEARTWORM QUESTIONS & ANSWERS



#### **WHAT ARE HEARTWORMS?**

Heartworms are foot-long worms that infest the heart, blood vessels and lungs of our pets. They can cause severe damage to major organ systems, including lung disease and heart failure.

#### WHERE DO THEY COME FROM?

Heartworms are transmitted as larvae from mammal to mammal by mosquitoes, so they're more prevalent in warmer seasons and climates. Heartworm mature into full-grown adults in about six months, and they can live up to 5-7 years in dogs and 2-3 years in cats.





#### WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?

Some pets never show signs of heartworm, which is why annual heartworm tests are so important. As the disease progresses, signs may include coughing, fatigue, lack of appetite and weight loss.

#### **HOW DO YOU PREVENT THEM?**

The medications used to treat heartworm do not work for cats, which makes prevention even more important for our feline friends. Many flea treatments also protect against heartworms. To further protect your pet, avoid heavily mosquito infested areas.





#### DOG SAFETY TIPS DURING SUMMER

PROTECT YOUR DOG FROM THE HEAT AND OTHER SUMMER HAZARDS

LIMIT OUTDOOR TIME

1

Bring water and stay beneath shady spots to minimize sun exposure.



RUNNING ERRANDS

2

Never leave your dog alone inside the car, especially during summer.



WATER ACTIVITIES

3

Watch out for hazards like jellyfish or undertow. Stay close to your dog while in the water.



**PARASITES** 



Ask your vet for preventive treatment against fleas, mosquitoes, or ticks and other parasites.



SUMMER EVENTS



Summer festivals expose your dog to loud noises, toxic food, and crowds. Your pet would be much safer and more comfortable at home.



i'd consistently react with joy to a smiling face or a simple treat





# CARING FOR YOUR DOG DURING WARM WEATHER



Dogs lose heat through panting, can only sweat through their paws, and are at high risk of getting heatstroke. Follow our top tips to keep your dog cool in the heat.



#### **WALKIES**

- Head out in the early morning or late evening when it's cooler.
- Don't run or cycle with your dog when it's hot.
- Avoid pavements. If the ground is too hot to touch with your hand for a few seconds, it's too hot for paws!

#### **KEEPING COOL**

- Prevent sunburn by using pet-safe sunscreen on ear tips and nose.
- Brush your dog regularly to keep their coat thin and free from matts or knots.
- Use frozen toys, paddling pools or water sprinklers to entertain and cool your dog down.

#### **REMEMBER:**

Dogs can die in hot environments. See: rspca.org.uk/dogsinhotcars

Never leave pets in vehicles, caravans, conservatories or outbuildings in warm weather.

#### **HEATSTROKE CAN KILL.**

Know the signs of heatstroke and contact a vet immediately if you spot them: heavy panting, excessive drooling, lethargy, drowsiness, uncoordinated movements, a state of collapse and vomiting.
