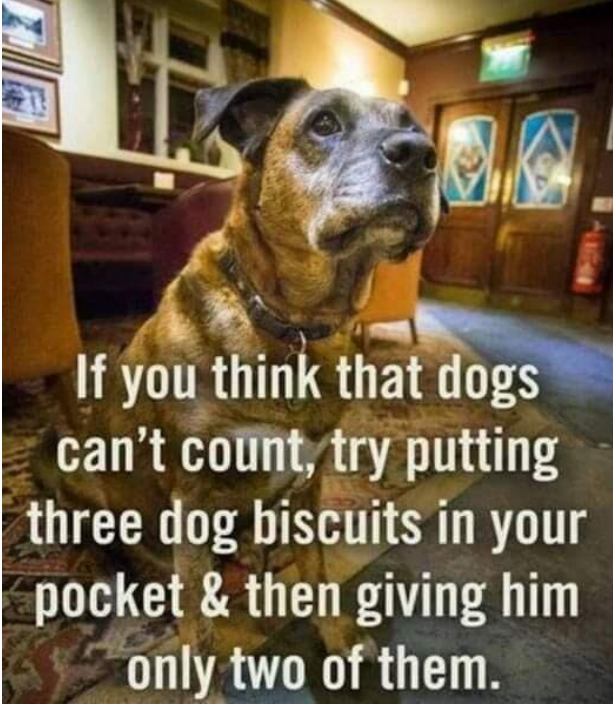

ALL ABOUT TICKS

DON'T GET SICK CHECK FOR TICKS!

PREVENTING TICK BITES

- Wear light colored clothing and tuck pants into your socks.
- Use an EPA-registered insect repellent and follow the label instructions.
- Treat outdoor clothing and gear with permethrin (insect repellent for clothing).
- Walk in the center of trails.
- Avoid brushing up against tall grass.
- Perform daily tick checks on yourself, children, and pets.
- Try to avoid known tick infested areas.
- Wear a hat if going into the woods or forests to prevent ticks from falling on your head.

WHERE ARE THE TICKS?



Ticks can be found in wooded areas, forests, tall grasses, and leaf litter.

AFTER YOU GET HOME

- Check your clothing
- Wash & Dry your clothes on high heat
- Examine your gear and pets
- Shower within two hours
- Check your body for ticks



HOW TO REMOVE A TICK

- Grasp the attached tick with tweezers as close to the skin as possible.
- Pull up on the tick with steady pressure. Do not squeeze or twist.
- Wash your hands and the bite area with soap and water.
- Dispose of the tick by sticking it to a piece of tape and placing it in the trash or flush the tick down your toilet.



BLACKLEGGED TICK

- To transmit Lyme Disease, the blacklegged tick must be attached for 36-48 hours or more.



Can transmit Lyme Disease, Anaplasmosis, Babesiosis, Ehrlichiosis, Borrelia miyamotoi Disease, and Powassan Virus

LONE STAR TICK

- To transmit Ehrlichiosis, the lone star tick needs to be attached for 24 to 50 hours.



Can transmit Ehrlichiosis, Borrelia miyamotoi Disease, and Powassan virus

GULF COAST TICK

- To transmit Rickettsiosis, the gulf coast tick needs to be attached for 10 - 20 hours



Can transmit Rickettsia parkeri Rickettsiosis

AMERICAN DOG TICK

- To transmit Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever, the gulf coast tick needs to be attached for 2 - 96 hours



Can transmit Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever and Tularemia

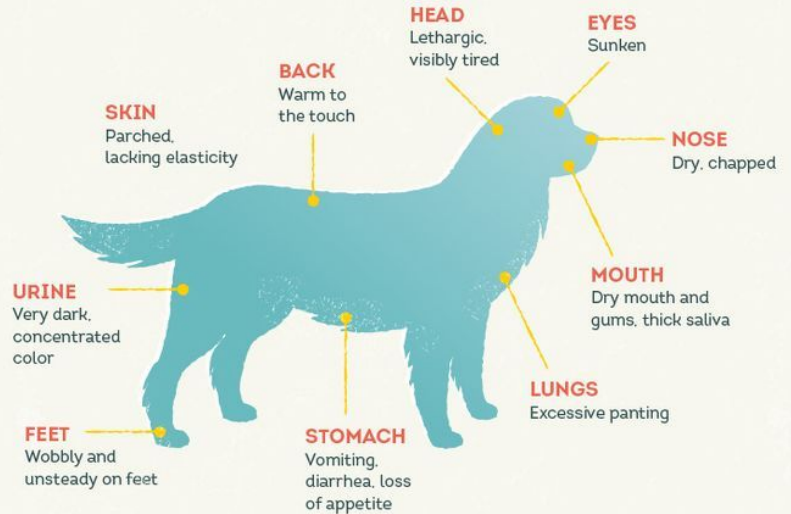
HOW TO SPOT LYME DISEASE

- Fever, chills, headache, fatigue, muscle and joint aches, and swollen lymph nodes may occur in the absence of rash
- Severe headaches and neck stiffness
- Additional EM rashes on other areas of the body
- Facial palsy (loss of muscle tone or droop on one or both sides of the face)
- Arthritis with severe joint pain and swelling, particularly the knees and other large joints

- Intermittent pain in tendons, muscles, joints, and bones
- Heart palpitations or an irregular heart beat
- Episodes of dizziness or shortness of breath
- Inflammation of the brain and spinal cord
- Nerve pain
- Shooting pains, numbness, or tingling in the hands or feet

SIGNS of a Dehydrated Dog

Make sure your pup gets plenty of shade and water. If you notice any of these symptoms, contact a pro ASAP.

FACTS YOU NEED TO KNOW

ALL SPECIES OF TICKS CAN TRANSMIT (MULTIPLE) DISEASES NOT ONLY LYME

TICKS ARE OFTEN CARRIED BY MIGRATORY BIRDS, MICE, DEER

ONE FEMALE TICK CAN LAY THOUSANDS OF EGGS

SOME TICKS ARE THE SIZE OF A 'DOT' OR 'POPPY SEED'

TICKS PREFER MOISTURE AND HUMID CONDITIONS (SHADE)

THEY QUEST (SEEK OUT VICTIMS) BY PERCHING AT THE EDGE OF FOLIAGE LIKE TALL GRASS - WAITING FOR YOU TO 'BRUSH' PAST

TICKS HAVE BEEN KNOWN TO OCCUPY TREES AS WELL AS SHRUB & NEAR CREEK BEDS IN MASS - WHERE INFECTED MICE OFTEN DEN

A TICK DOES NOT HAVE TO BE ATTACHED FOR LONG TO TRANSMIT DISEASE

YOU MAY NEVER SEE IT OR FEEL IT BITE OR GET A RASH

TICKS LIKE TO 'CRAWL UP' SO TUCK YOUR PANTS INTO YOUR SOCKS AND USE A TICK REPELLANT. SPRAY ON YOUR PANTS, SOCKS AND SHOES

PERFORM TICK CHECKS AFTER BEING IN WOODED AREAS AND USE PREVENATIVES ON YOUR PETS AS WELL. PLACE ALL CLOTHING IN A HOT CLOTHES DRYER FOR HALF AN HOUR AFTER BEING IN SUSPECTED AREAS OF TICK HABITAT TO KILL THEM AND ANY EGGS.

NEVER APPLY ANYTHING TO AN ATTACHED TICK OR TRY TO BURN IT OFF. DO NOT TWIST IT OR SQUISH IT WHILE ATTACHED. THIS IS ONE SAFER METHOD SHOWN. CLEANSE WOUND AFTER WITH ALCOHOL /PEROXIDE AND APPLY A TOPICAL ANTIBIOTIC

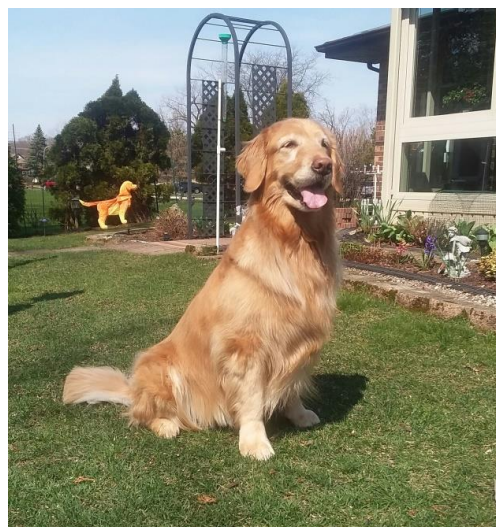
