



GABOC Membership Meeting Wednesday, June 7th 2023

Minutes were approved as read by B McMillan an 2nd by Karen Schlipf

President Joan started off the meeting with a welcome address to new Members that were present, Audrey Stilling and Barb Misch, each member in attendance gave a brief self introduction.

Discussion about the recent dinner started off the meeting, everyone in attendance had attended the dinner, except Barb, Pinny and Karen. Pattie suggested that going forward for future dinners, it would be nice to have name tags provided at the dinner.

Joan encouraged and strongly suggested anyone in attendance to please consider writing an article about their Glenbard experience either as a trial exhibitor or a Monday or Tuesday night trainee, any articles or photos to share should be sent to Cheri Nicholas at cherindean@gmail.com by June 25th. The 25th of the month is the deadline for anything that needs to be included in the BARKS newsletter.

Karen gave us the new members that have applied since last meeting, Barb Lyon Misch and Audrey Stilling, both were voted on and approved. Both ladies were in attendance at the meeting. Isabel Lopez is a membership renewal.

A brief discussion ensued about the non monetary value of being a GABOC Member, the company and shared experience of members and instructors is priceless and is one of the benefits that this club offers. The dues are low, but the experience and mentorship is priceless.

Treasurers Report, given by Joan in Shawn's absence, current balance is \$67K monies there are some checks that have been deposited and not yet recorded, the balance has been closer to \$70K and has been stable at that amount for the last few months. July rent is due. The treasurer report has been approved as read and filed for audit.

A comment by Sandi Stephenson was made about this past Tuesday night drop in with a record number of Confo dogs that came in and were expertly handled by Confo Instructor Sheila Gardner. A round of applause for Sheila.

Joan said that the January Budget is due to be reviewed at the next Board meeting, to determine if we are on track with the budget \$\$ targets that were set forth in January.

A discussion about the need for a DOT and we asked for volunteers, and Puppy Instructor, Pattie Imburgia volunteered to be DOT with a request of support and help from previous DOT's as well as a request for a description of the job, and Pat Senne said the DOT works closely with the Registrar in setting up classes as one of the responsibilities of the DOT. We also told her she is responsible for the behavior of the club participants on training nights as to how they handle themselves and their dogs. And that she would be expected to help with getting subs and assistants as well as new instructors for



the classes. She said she and Mary Ramsden are currently mentoring two previous puppy students who have expressed an interest in learning how to be instructors, so she is off to a great start!

Carol mentioned at the last Board Meeting we finalized the Award Requirements and will send those to Laura Setar for website publication. Two notable changes were that we added the RN and BN (to be earned together) to be added to the CD requirement to be eligible for an Award Plaque. We also have added the Preferred classes to our list of classes to get plates. A special flyer was created by Carol and Pat to offer a discounted class for shelters that adopt dogs, like the Western Humane Society and any others in the area, the discount would be class cost of \$99 as opposed to \$130. They would have to call it in to Pat Senne the Registrar so she could make the discount applicable.

Gina Hoener mentioned that since she and Kaelen Dundek have been closely monitoring our Social Media presence, that she has seen readership increased by 180%. She encouraged all in attendance to go to our website often and click on the "Like" icon to increase awareness, as it then spreads to all contacts of the person that hit the like button. It is easier to monitor the FB presence as more of us are on FB than on Instagram. Instagram is just starting to catch on and be a presence for us.

Sandi asked for a substitute for her Open Class on the 19th of June, as she will be out of town. Pat Senne offered and so did Joan Mazat.

Pattie Imburgia said that Mary Ramsden told her to tell us that she had taken some photo's of her class activities and had submitted them but has not seen them published either on FB or in Barks, we reminded her of Cheri's email address for the Barks and to also share with Gina Hoener for the FB posting. <u>New business:</u> Joan asked for a vote on offering a special award for any member who goes above and beyond for the Club and to name it the Lynn Weiss Memorial Award (In memory of a long time member and outstanding volunteer from the past to carry on her tradition and her efforts). It was suggested that the outstanding member be nominated by the membership and then voted on. There was some people who were concerned that it not become a popularity contest and to try to find a way to vote on it so it would be clear and fair. It was decided that the idea would be proposed to the membership via Barks and voted on in the next publication. Joan will be writing a detailed description and asking readers to vote on it. Final determination on this was tabled until the next meeting.

<u>New Business</u>: June picnic (end of the training season) June 26th will be the club picnic, Candy Ellis is the one who coordinates this effort and she was not at the meeting, Pat Senne will contact Candy for further details on how it is to be done. Typically, the Club pays for main meal such as (hot dogs/HamBurger) and anyone else brings a dish to share.

Bette McMillan reported on the Agility Trial, she said the entries were lower than previous years for the June trial, and that we had to get an out of town Judge that costs more than a local one, the Judge had to be flown in from North Carolina. She reminded us that October 14-15th will be the next Agility Trial and it will be at the Farm as well.

Joan reviewed the need for help at our November trial, and reminded all of us that we will need help for Thursday Rally Match, Friday OB Match and the two main days of the trial and worker sheet will be sent out. A question was raised as to how permanent is the decision to continue to have the Trial In New



Lenox, and it was asked what do we need to do to bring it back to Dupage. The financial pros and cons was discussed. Again, it was decided that a vote would be put out in Barks to find out how many of us feel very strongly to bring it back, and to look more closely at the financials and realize that some events make money and some don't, how off balance will we be if we bring the trial back to Dupage.

We will review this discussion once again at the next Board Meeting. Either Shawn or Pat will review the cost of the Trial to be at Dupage with Jim McGuire so we know what the financial burden would be to bring it back for 2024.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:53 pm Sandi made the motion and Pat Seconded the motion to adjourn.






