




October 3 is our next correction match. Tell your friends! Helpers are always welcome, let me know if you are interested!

"Are dog parks good or bad?"

It's a question I hear from concerned pet parents all the time.

And I don't blame them for asking, Kathryn —

Because the truth is, there's so much conflicting information out there...

And there's one thing most of that information isn't factoring in:

Your unique dog.

After all, no two dogs are the same — so what's good for YOUR dog might not be good for another...

So how can YOU decide if a dog park is right for your pup?

Let's weigh the pros & cons:

✓ Pro #1: Village Green

Like us, dogs are social creatures...

So you might think of the dog park as your pup's town square, village green or local watering hole.

It's a place where they can meet other four-legged friends, learn how to get along with other breeds, sizes, ages, and temperaments...

And hopefully make lifelong friends — which can help <u>improve their emotional well-being and overall</u> <u>quality of life</u>.

X Con #1: Bad Behavior Magnet

Also like us, dogs mimic behavior...

So depending on the dogs that are at the park that day, your pup could come away with some pretty bad habits...

Including rough play, excessive barking or humping, or ignoring your commands.

✓ Pro #2: Bonding Opportunity

Your dog loves being with you — and the dog park can be a new, fun place for you to spend some quality time together.

The exciting location can be a stimulating change of pace for your pup, especially if they spend a lot of time indoors...

X Con #2: Fight Club

Unfortunately, fights at the dog park are all too common.

Your dog could be knocked down in a scuffle, or in a worst-case scenario, even attacked by an aggressive dog.

So if you do visit a dog park, be sure to <u>remain vigilant at all times</u> to protect your pup.

V Pro #3: Run it Out

Exercise is crucial to canine health...

And the dog park is a perfect place to get it!

In fact, just an hour at the park can provide your pup with a full day's worth of exercise...

X Con #3: Danger Zone

You may already know that the dog park isn't the cleanest place in the world...

But some are so dirty, they can actually make your pup *sick*.

An unmaintained park (with dirty puddles, piles of poop, and garbage) can be a *breeding ground for bacteria*...

And since illnesses can easily be passed from dog to dog...

Your dog could come away with a common canine infection or parasite, like giardia, kennel cough, coccidia, parvovirus, and worms.

Before taking your dog to the dog park, check out the park on your own first.

Some parks are better than others — and you'll want to make sure you're bringing your pup to a safe, clean spot.

Make sure the grass or ground is well-maintained and free of sharp rocks, glass, and debris...

And that the park has clean water bowls, trash bins, and disposal areas for dog waste.

Also, do your homework to find a park that requires dogs to be vaccinated and trained...

That way, you can mitigate the risk of your pup getting sick or picking up bad habits.

At the park:

Remain vigilant at all times.

Keep a close eye on your dog and the dogs they interact with.

It's normal for pups to play or wrestle, but if another dog bares their teeth or snaps at your dog, that's probably a sign they don't want to play.

Remove your dog from the situation immediately by calling them over — and if the aggressive behavior continues, leave the park.

(If your dog is bitten by another dog – get their parent's phone number. Your vet will want to know if they've been vaccinated for rabies and other viruses.)

<u>Mind the heat</u> — On hot days, try to visit the park in the morning or late afternoon when the weather is cooler.

Make sure there's a clean water bowl available at the park (or bring your own) and encourage your pup to drink from it frequently.

Respect the park — pick up your dog's poop and encourage your fellow dog parents to do the same.

Lastly, <u>listen to your gut</u> — if something feels wrong, leash up your pup and head out of the park.

Post-park:

Once you're home, scan your pup for <u>fleas</u>, <u>ticks</u>, <u>and injuries</u>.

Run a fine-toothed comb through your dog's fur, starting from the head and working your way down to the tail...

And then rub your hands over your dog's body, feeling for any lumps, bumps, or signs of redness or swelling.

Pay attention to any areas that your dog reacts to or seem sensitive.

Tip: Make sure to check behind their ears and between their toes.

Reward them with a treat and plenty of water, rest and relaxation for the remainder of the day — they earned it!

I hope these tips helped, Kathryn.

Remember, you're the best judge of whether the dog park is right for your unique pup...

So I hope this email empowers you to make a choice you feel good about.


Dr. Richter's Dog Park Dos & Don'ts:







Don't bring unvaccinated dogs to the park.





Do keep the park clean by picking up your dog's poop and encouraging others to do the same.



Don't bring toys or treats to the park

 they could invite possessive, aggressive behavior.

(If you must bring a toy, opt for a tennis ball — just be prepared, you might leave without it ;)



Protect against ticks before/after attending the dog park with a preventative medicine (like an ointment or a pill) and a good screening afterwards.



or sick dog to the park.

They could be a hazard to other pups and people.



Do know the rules — make sure your dog is fixed, vaccinated, and/or registered BEFORE entering the dog park (every park has different rules).

Meeting called to order 7:10 PM

Mary Therese Marosits arrived 7:56 PM.

Joan brought up not having Zoom at the meetings because she cannot monitor it and run the meeting. If someone would like to do that we could bring back Zoom for the meetings. Xelines offered to do it.

Joan stated at our September match we did not have many preregistered people, but then a lot of Novice A people showed up.

Vice Presidents report: Karen had three applications for membership.

Heather Shedd with Lux and Nox - Dutch Shepherds

Mary Schuenemann with Bookin' - Golden

Kelsey Romanowski with Novo and Bree - Belgian Shepherds

All were voted into membership.

Karen stated we have 73 members and 21 lifetime members.

Joan passed out the treasures report. Shawn was pleased that we are in the black.

June minutes taken by Pat S and sent out in Constant Contact were approved. Motion by Sandi and seconded by Mary.

Sandi wanted to thank Dean for making the rings bigger.

We still have not ordered ring gates and extensions.

Pat mentioned that Lyons had some accordion ring barriers that they wanted to dispose of. She would follow up on that and see what the cost might be.

Karen said she had some mats that she would give up.

Registrar report: Pat said at this time we are not going to do a therapy dog class. She suggested we might consider an Advanced CGC class if we can find someone to teach it.

That might entice some people to continue on with their dogs.

4H: Sandi and Pat judged at IL State 4H show at Granny Rose K9 Enrichment Center in Dixon.

The kids did a good job.

One of the girls in Laura Setar's and Tom's 4H class got second place in Best of the Best

There was some discussion about getting her some sort of award for \$25 or less. Pat will follow up with Laura on it.

Rally needs an instructor. Setting up the ring is not enough. Pat said she could oversee it if we moved Rally to Monday. Pat is at Lyons on Tuesday. Xelines said she could assist Pat.

On October 17th Sheila will not be able to do her conformation class. There was some discussion about finding a substitute for that evening. Carole mentioned several years ago we had a guest conformation person come in to teach one night.

We will look for someone to cover Sheila's class.

DOT: Pattie needs to know her duties as DOT.

She wanted to know how the new instructors were working out.

Sandi felt one of the most important duties of the DOT was to have a list of substitute instructors.

Francis was suggested as a substitute.

Ed said he needs Pattie's cell number in case he would have to contact her if he could not make his class. Karen said the DOT should have a key for the building.

Membership: Ed said it takes too long to be approved for membership. Is there some way it could be streamlined to do quicker? Waiting for bimonthly meetings takes too long. Would this be a By Law amendment?

Our **By Laws** need to be updated. Carole said it needs to be put in a Word doc. Gina felt she could do that. Gina, Ed, Sandi, Pat and Carole offered to work on it.

Classes: Gina felt we should raise our class prices. She said we were one of the cheapest. She had compared ours to For Your Canine and other places.

Carole said her other club is raising their prices next year to \$130 for Puppy which is 10 weeks and \$150 for Beginners which is 12 weeks. They have always been cheaper than Glenbard.

Pat pointed out that our fees are in line with Lyons and Fox Valley. She said training facilities are higher because they are not all volunteers like dog clubs are. Carole said the instructors get paid. Joan asked Gina to write up a proposal for a fee increase.

Joan mentioned she had gone to training at Francis field on Labor Day which was suppose to be 10 AM to 2 PM. It had started at 8 AM and the place was packed.

Our Obedience and Rally premium is out. Thursday is set up and then the Thursday fun match. Lynn is going to wash the jumps for us.

Gina wanted to have the entry fees explained. All 6 trials, 3 Obedience and 3 Rally were a 1st entry of \$28. If you entered the same dog in anyone of the 6 twice then it would be \$22 for the second entry. Joan pointed out that some awards and or titles required you to enter the same dog two or three times (in different classes) at the same trial.

Karen mentioned doing something for Dick Schaefer at our trial. It is too late to put anything in the premium.

Joan will do signup sheet for volunteers for the trials.

New Mary asked if you had to be a member to volunteer. No, we welcome all volunteers.

Sandi asked about coffee for the trial. Candy takes care of that.

The food was excellent last year from the restaurant on the corner.

Pattie mentioned the Dianne Allen seminar the following week at Francis field.

Nominating Committee: Sandi reported that all the officers agreed to stay on. We have two board members up. One had not responded. The other was possibly. Gina volunteered for the board if one was needed. Sandi nominated Ed for the board.



THINGS TO REMEMBER AS SUMMER TURNS TO AUTUMN



1. Fleas and mifes



Fleas can be a menace all year round and due to central heating will be attacking your dog even in the depths of winter! Consider treating the house with a suitable product. Ask your vet to recommend a good product — treatment will can provide cover for several months on end.

Tiny harvest mites are very difficult to see, but pay special attention to your pet's tummy, ears, eyes and paws during the autumn months. **Both fleas and mites can cause infections and other problems.**

2. Pesticides

Many people use household poisons to keep rodents and insects at bay. If your pet ingests one of these highly toxic products it could produce illness or even death. Beware,



in your own home of where you place these products and when walking your dog, be sure you watch him carefully.

3. Children's foys



children may leave their tiny toys and toxic craft material such as glue, magic markers etc. laying around so try to keep a close eye on this and try to get the children to tidy up after themselves!

If your pup chews and/or swallows one of these items he could experience an upset tummy or even more serious—a blockage.

4. Mushrooms and other outdoor hazards



aware of the growing threat of poisonous mushrooms during the autumn months. Should you spot your dog eating a mushroom and are unsure if it is poisonous or not, contact your vet immediately — better to be safe than sorry.

just like older humans, aging pets may have developed arthritic joints that make them more sensitive to the cold weather. Think about getting them a dog coat and check that your walks are not too long for them.



6. Kiffy in the Car

Apparently, it's a pretty common thing and it only takes being mindful and beeping the horn a few times to potentially save a life. Don't want to wake the neighbours with a horn beep?

Knocking a few times on the bonnet will also do the trick.



7. The anti-freeze

is very scary because it's too easy to make this mistake. You're in your garage with your dog, winterizing your car, you spill a little anti-freeze on the garage floor and mean to clean it up, but before you do, he has already taken a few licks because it smells sweet and good to him. It's very dangerous and can kill. Take the time to be extra careful with this toxic stuff



8. Whipping

Whipping out those special brushes that remove a dog's undercoat to reduce shedding? — don't use them in winter. Your dog needs that undercoat during the colder weather to keep them warm.


From I-80
