





#### **AKC Rally Tip Sheet – SPECIAL EDITION (February 2020)**

## AKC Rally Regulations – Updated Rally Regulations and Editorial Clarifications by the AKC

On January 16, 2020, the AKC made two announcements on its blog for Obedience and Rally Judges.

First, the AKC has updated the Rally Regulations booklet to incorporate all of the changes that occurred in the past few years. The updated booklet has a pink cover, with the date of February 1, 2019 (the date of the last substantive change to the Regulations). You can order a printed copy of the updated Regulations through the AKC Store for \$12.00. You can also download a copy of the updated Regulations through the AKC website.

Second, the AKC has made "Editorial Clarifications" to the updated Regulations. The AKC made changes to certain parts of the Regulations to <u>CLARIFY</u> certain areas to better reflect the AKC's intent and/or to make the Regulations consistent and/or less confusing. The following describes the changes.

- 1. <u>Chapter 1, Section 15 (Transfers)</u>. This Section covers situations <u>after</u> the closing date for a trial, where a handler wants to transfer his entry for that trial from his original class to another class in that trial. The AKC clarified that such a transfer had to meet certain requirements, including that the class the handler wants to switch to had already been scheduled to be held at that trial. For example, if you finished your Rally Novice title after the closing date for a future trial, you cannot transfer to the Rally Intermediate class in that future trial if that class had not been already scheduled for that trial. You cannot transfer to a class that does not exist at that trial.
- 2. <u>Chapter 1, Section 16 (Entry Eligibility, Change of Entry)</u>. This Section covers the eligibility requirements for handlers and dogs for the various Rally classes. The AKC added two paragraphs called "Judging Procedures Regarding Eligibility" at the end of this Section, to describe the procedures that the club, the trial secretary and the judge should follow when there is a question about the eligibility of a handler and/or a dog to compete in a certain class.
- 3. <u>Chapter 1, Section 19 (Disturbances)</u>. This Section used to say that a judge must <u>excuse</u> a dog that is not under control by its handler, and any handler who willfully interferes with another handler or that handler's dog. The AKC changed the word "excuse" to "release".
- 4. <u>Chapter 2, Section 8 (Judge's Book and Score Sheets)</u>. The AKC added a sentence to this Section to describe how copies of the completed score sheets from the judge's book are to be made available for handlers to review right after the ribbons have been awarded in each class.
- 5. <u>Chapter 2, Section 15 (Collars)</u>. The AKC added a sentence to this Section to require that no dog may enter the ring, either for judging or for awards, with unacceptable equipment. Other parts of this Section describe (1) how each dog must wear a properly fitted collar approved by the judge, (2) how no special training collars, such as electronic collars or prong collars, are permitted, and (3) that nothing may be hanging from the collar.
- 6. <u>Chapter 2, Section 19 (Misbehavior)</u>. The AKC revised the first sentence to emphasize that the handler is required to enter and exit the ring with the dog under control and without jumping, pulling or tugging on the leash. Other types of misbehavior are also described in this Section. The AKC also added a

- sentence at the end of the first paragraph to require the judge to release a dog for uncontrolled behavior, such as excessive barking or running away from its handler.
- 7. <u>Chapter 2, Section 22 (Placement of Signs)</u>. Previously the AKC had permitted, but not required, the judges to use the duplicate signs for certain exercises in which the handler was required to walk away from the dog to give additional signals and commands. The AKC now <u>requires</u> the judges to use such duplicate signs to display them to the handler who has walked away from the dog. These signs are:

```
Sign 206: Down While Heeling – Call to Finish – Sit
```

- Sign 207: Stand While Heeling Call to Finish Sit
- Sign 208: Stand Leave Sit Call Front Finish Sit
- Sign 209: Stand Leave Down Call Front Finish Sit
- Sign 311: Backup 3 Steps Stand and Leave Call to Finish Forward
- Sign 317: Halt Leave Recall Finish Right Sit
- Sign 318: Halt Leave Recall Finish Left Sit

The AKC now also <u>requires</u> the judges to place the directional signs for the three "Send to Cone" exercises (Signs 306, 307 and 308) on the backsides of the initial signs for those exercises. Sign 103 (Send Over Jump) may be placed on the jump or to the right of the handler's path.

- 8. <u>Chapter 2, Section 23 (Sign Descriptions and Additional Information)</u>. For Sign 298 (Sit Stay), the AKC requires that the handler must be able to walk <u>forward</u> to get the leash. In other words, the leash may not be placed behind or to the side of the handler.
  - In addition, for Signs 301-303 (301A-303A), the AKC clarified that the handler is not required to halt at the Sign for the jump, and may halt prior to or after the Sign. The handler is also not required to walk to a specific location on the other side of the jump to call the dog. Such distances, together with the path each handler takes to get to the newly established line (i.e., the line established after a right turn, left turn, or about turn), will vary. The handler still must turn in the correct direction to avoid an Incorrectly Performed penalty of 10 points, but such turn is not required to be at a specific location.
- 9. <u>Glossary of Rally Terms</u>. In the definition of "<u>Finish</u>," the dog must move smartly "towards or" [added words] to heel position. The AKC added the definition of "<u>Released</u>" as "A dog must be released if it is not under the handler's control. A dog may be released from competition in the class for misbehavior."
- 10. AKC Rally Signs and Descriptions. The AKC edited the following sign descriptions:
- Sign 101 (Halt About Turn Right Forward): The AKC added the word "together" after the words "the dog and handler turn 180 degrees to the right." The last sentence now reads, "The dog and handler turn 180 degrees to the right together and heel forward."
- Sign 102 (Halt About "U" Turn Forward): The AKC added the word "together" after the words "the dog and handler turn 180 degrees to the left." The last sentence now reads, "The dog and handler turn 180 degrees to the left together and heel forward."
- <u>Sign 108 (Offset Figure 8)</u>: The sign description describes how distractions (toys or treats) are to be placed by the Figure 8 cones. The AKC clarified that such distractions are to be toys <u>OR</u> treats, not one of each kind.
- <u>Signs 119 and 120 (Right[Left] Turn Dog Circles Right Forward)</u>: The AKC changed the language <u>from</u> "the handler turns right[left] and the dog circles around the handler to the right" <u>to</u> "AS [added word] the

- handler turns right[left], the dog circles around the handler to the right." The AKC clarified that the handler should be turning right or left while the dog is making the circle around the handler.
- <u>Signs 214 and 215 (Stand Right[Left] Turn Forward)</u>: The AKC added the word "together" after the words "the dog and handler turn right[left]." The last sentence now reads, "The dog and handler turn right[left] together and then heel forward."
- <u>Sign 314 (Cloverleaf)</u>: The AKC added the diagrams of the three possible paths through the four cones as a part of the sign description.
- <u>Sign 322 (Stand Leave 2 Steps Call to Heel)</u>: The AKC removed the word "then" from the third sentence, which now reads, "The handler begins to heel forward, and commands the dog to heel." Now this Sign is consistent with Advanced Sign 118, where the dog sits, instead of stands. For both signs, after the handler's PAUSE, the handler begins to heel forward and, at the same time, commands the dog to heel.
