AKC Rally Tip Sheet \#2 (published April 2019)

## AKC Rally Novice Signs \#1 through \#42

The first level of AKC Rally competition is Novice, and this class is divided into Novice A and Novice B. Everyone can enter Novice B, but only certain persons and certain dogs are eligible to enter Novice A. The AKC Rally Regulations describe the eligibility requirements for Novice A in Chapter 3, Section 2.

The Novice course will have 10 to 15 signs (plus the Start and Finish signs), and all of these signs will be from the Novice sign category (signs \#1 through \#42). The signs will be on sign holders that are numbered in the order in which they are to be performed during the course (except that the Start and Finish signs will not be numbered). The Novice signs will also appear in all of the more advanced classes.

The Novice course will be performed with your dog on a leash at all times. While you are performing the course, you are not allowed to touch your dog to gain its attention, or to aid it in performing any exercise, or for any other reason, except that you may touch your dog if it gets tangled in the leash. If there is a tangle, stop and gently untangle your dog and leash, and then proceed. You start with 100 points, but you lose points for every infraction; at the end you need 70 points to qualify.

You may use multiple words (commands and praise, but no harsh words) and multiple signals during the course. The AKC Rally Regulations allow you to clap your hands and pat your legs in the Novice, Intermediate and Advanced classes, but not in the Excellent and Masters classes. It would benefit you to use clapping and patting only when absolutely needed, so that you do not develop the habit of clapping/patting in the higher-level classes. And do not even think of whistling, or snapping your fingers, or stomping your feet, or doing anything else that is not specifically allowed by the Rally Regulations.

The first sign on the course will be the unnumbered Start sign (\#1). You will enter the ring when the judge calls you in, and you will then proceed to stop near the Start sign. The sign should be on your RIGHT, and you will wait beside or slightly behind the sign. There might also be a line on the floor to indicate the start line. Your dog does not have to be sitting at the start. The judge will ask if you are ready. If you are ready, reply "Yes" or "Ready" or a similar word. If you are not ready, say "No" until you are ready, then tell the judge that you are ready. The judge will say "Forward," and at that point the timer will start the stopwatch and you should begin the course.

The end of the course will be at the unnumbered Finish sign (\#2), and you must pass that sign with the sign on your RIGHT, at which point the timer will stop the stopwatch. Because your dog is on a leash, after you pass that sign you are then free to leave the ring immediately, with your dog still on a loose leash and still under control. It is nice (but not required) to say "Thank you" to the judge while you are leaving. Then you and your dog can party after you leave the ring!


Many signs will be placed on your right. Some signs will be placed in front of you as you approach the sign to indicate a change of direction (such as a turn). And signs for the stations with cones might be placed by or near a cone instead of on your right. All signs should be performed near the sign, usually right next to the sign or one to two feet in front of it, but take care - you will lose points if you or your dog touch or knock over a sign. If you pass the sign without performing the sign, the judge will conclude that you are skipping the sign, and you will not qualify in the class.

There are 40 more signs to learn and practice for the Novice class. Some of the signs are very basic, such as the Halt - Sit sign (\#3) where you halt and your dog sits in heel position. Other signs indicate multiple actions to be performed at that sign, such as the Call Front - Finish Right - Sit sign (\#15) where you back up and call your dog to sit in front of you, and then you tell your dog to finish to your right, and then your dog sits at your left side in heel position.

It is very important to read the entire written description for each sign as contained in the AKC Rally Regulations. Pay particular attention to the language that is underlined and in bold-face type, because that language indicates a principal part of the exercise that must be performed correctly in order to not lose 10 points for that sign.

It might help you to learn the signs by thinking of them in groups according to their features, as described below, instead of thinking of the signs as 40 unique signs.

Heeling-Related Signs - Many signs involve heeling, with you walking and your dog walking beside you on your left on a loose leash in heel position. Sometimes you are walking forward in a straight line, and other times you are walking in curves, spirals or circles. At all times your dog should maintain heel position with a loose leash, including before the sign, at the sign and after the sign. These signs include:

Heeling: $\quad$ Normal Pace (\#19) // Slow Pace (\#17) // Fast Pace (\#18)
Moving Side Step Right (\#20) (it is important for your dog to MOVE WITH YOU)

Halts and Heeling: Halt - Fast Forward From Sit (\#28)
Halt - Slow Forward From Sit (\#36)
Halt - 1, 2 and 3 Steps (\#25) (after the halt/sit, you take 1 step forward and halt and your dog sits in heel position, then you take 2 steps forward and halt and your dog sits in heel position, then you take 3 steps forward and halt and your dog sits in heel position; your dog MUST MOVE WITH YOU each time)


Heeling with Cones: Spiral Right - Dog Outside (\#21) // Spiral Left - Dog Inside (\#22)
Straight Figure 8 Weave Twice (\#23) (enter with first cone on your left) Serpentine Weave Once (\#24) (enter with first cone on your left) Figure 8 - No Distractions (\#32) (cross the center line three times) Offset Serpentine Right (\#41) (enter with the first cone on your right) Offset Serpentine Left (\#42) (enter with the first cone on your left)
Be careful while going around the cones, because you can lose points if you or your dog touches or knocks over a cone.

Heeling with Circles: $\quad 360$ Degree Right Turn (\#11)
360 Degree Left Turn (\#12)
Both of these signs specify a tight turn. There is no change in direction with these circles, meaning that after the circle is completed, you continue forward in the same direction as before the circle.

Signs with Turns - These signs involve a "change in direction," meaning that after the turn is completed, you continue forward in a different direction than before the turn.

Right Turns: Right Turn (\#5)
Diagonal Right (\#39)
270 Degree Right Turn (\#9) (the sign specifies a tight turn to the right)
Halt - Right Turn - Forward (\#33) (you and your dog turn right TOGETHER)
Left Turns: Left Turn (\#6)
Diagonal Left (\#40)
270 Degree Left Turn (\#10) (the sign specifies a tight turn to the left)
Halt - Left Turn - Forward (\#34) (you and your dog turn left TOGETHER)

About Turns: About Turn Right (\#7) (you and your dog turn RIGHT 180 degrees)
About U Turn (\#8) (you and your dog turn LEFT 180 degrees)
Loop Right (\#37) // Loop Left (\#38)

Combination Turn: Left About Turn (\#29) (you make an about turn to the left, and at the same time your dog moves around you to the right and back into heel position)


Call Fronts - A "call front" is an obedience exercise in which you and your dog are walking forward, then you stop forward motion and step backward several steps while calling your dog to sit in front of you. There are four signs that involve a "call front" paired with a finish and sometimes with a sit.

Call Dog Front - Finish Right - Forward (\#13)
Call Dog Front - Finish Left - Forward (\#14)
In both of these signs, there is a "call front" and then a "finish" (one sign for a right finish, and one sign for a left finish), and then a "forward" where you start walking forward AS SOON AS your dog has cleared your path, meaning that YOU DO NOT WAIT for your dog to come to your left side and sit.

Call Dog Front - Finish Right - Sit (\#15)
Call Dog Front - Finish Left - Sit (\#16)
In both of these signs, there is a "call front" and then a "finish" (one sign for a right finish, and one sign for a left finish), and here YOU DO WAIT for your dog to come to your left side and SIT before you start walking forward.

Call Front - Return to Heel (\#35) (you take several steps backward while you call your dog to front with a sit, then your dog stays sitting while you walk around behind your dog to heel position, where YOU MUST PAUSE before you start walking again; the word "pause" is included in the written description for the sign, but is not included on the sign itself, so YOU need to remember the "pause")

Call Front - 1, 2 and 3 Steps Backward - Forward (\#26) (you take several steps backward and call your dog to front with a sit, then take 1 step backward with your dog MOVING WITH YOU and sitting in front of you, the same for 2 steps and then 3 steps, then tell your dog to finish (either way) and you start walking AS SOON AS your dog has cleared your path)

Position Signs - For some signs your dog takes a position or positions on command while in heel position. Make sure that your dog holds each position long enough for the judge to see it.

Halt - Sit (\#3)
Halt - Sit - Down (\#4)
Stop and Down (\#27) (you and your dog are walking forward when you stop forward motion and your dog downs in heel position; judges want your dog go down directly from standing to the down without sitting before downing; your dog's sitting might cause a loss of points)

Halt - Walk Around (\#30)
Halt - Down - Walk Around (\#31)
These 2 signs include your walking around your dog back to heel position while your dog maintains its sit or down position. When you are at heel position, YOU MUST PAUSE before proceeding. The word "pause" is included in the written descriptions for these signs, but is not included on the signs themselves, so YOU need to remember the "pause."

## GLOBAL RULES TO MEMORIZE FOR ALL CLASSES:

- Whenever you "walk around your dog" or "return to your dog" at a sign, YOU MUST PAUSE before continuing with the course, even though the word "pause" is not included on the sign.
- Your dog's leash should ALWAYS be loose, or you might lose points for a tight lead.
- BE COURTEOUS TO ALL. This is a sport we do with our dogs for fun!
