





AKC Rally Tip Sheet #4 (published July 2019)

AKC Rally Excellent Signs #201 through #216, plus #298 and #299

Congratulations! Again! You and your dog entered at least three Advanced level classes with at least two different judges, and you earned three qualifying scores of at least 70 points out of a possible 100 points. Your dog has now earned the <u>AKC Rally Advanced (RA) title</u>, and the AKC will send you a title certificate to mark this wonderful event.

The next higher-level class is Excellent, and again there are new signs with more challenging exercises. All exercises are performed off-leash, two jumps are required, and the sit-stay exercise is required.

To earn the <u>AKC Rally Excellent (RE) title</u>, you must earn at least three qualifying scores in the Excellent class with at least two different judges. The Excellent course will have 15 to 20 signs (plus the Start and Finish signs), with a minimum of two Advanced level signs and a minimum of three Excellent signs, plus the two required jumps and the required "Sit Stay" sign; the remaining signs will be from the Novice level. Hang on to your Tip Sheet #2 about the Novice signs and Tip Sheet #3 about the Advanced signs.

The Excellent class is divided into Excellent A and Excellent B. Everyone can enter Excellent B, but only certain persons and certain dogs are eligible to enter Excellent A. The AKC Rally Regulations describe the eligibility requirements for Excellent A in Chapter 3, Section 12. If you enter Excellent A without meeting those requirements, the AKC will void your qualifying score(s) and any title from that class, and you must start over to earn the RE title in the Excellent B class.

You may still use multiple words (commands and praise, but no harsh words) and multiple signals during the course. <u>BUT</u> in the Excellent and Master class you are NOT allowed to clap or pat your leg, and you are NOT allowed to touch your dog to stand him for any sign that requires a dog to be in the stand position.

After you have earned the RE title, you have several options if you continue in AKC Rally:

- You may enter the Advanced B class only.
- You may enter the Excellent B class only.
- You may enter both the Advanced B class and the Excellent B class at the same trial. If you earn a qualifying score in <u>both</u> classes, you earn a leg toward the <u>AKC Rally Advanced Excellent (RAE) title</u>. You need to earn <u>TEN</u> RAE legs to obtain the RAE title.
- You may enter the Master class only. You need to earn <u>TEN</u> qualifying scores with at least two different judges to obtain the <u>AKC Rally Master (RM) title</u>.
- You may enter <u>all</u> of the Advanced B, the Excellent B and the Master classes at the same trial. If you qualify in all three classes, you earn a RAE leg, a RM leg, a triple qualifying leg toward the <u>AKC Rally Champion (RACH) title</u>, and, if you earn scores of 91 and higher, points toward the RACH title.

There are 18 new signs to learn and practice for the Excellent class. Again, it is very important to read the entire written description for each sign as contained in the AKC Rally Regulations. Pay particular attention to the language that is **underlined and in bold-face type**, because that language indicates a principal part of the exercise that must be performed correctly in order to not lose 10 points for that sign.

Heeling-Related Signs

Heeling Backward: The <u>Backup 3 Steps (#205) sign</u> calls for you and your dog, while heeling, to reverse direction walking BACKWARD at least 3 steps together, and then continue heeling forward. Your dog MUST remain standing throughout, and should not be walking sideways or facing you as you back up.

Walking backward can be a challenge for every dog. It might be helpful to practice this with your dog's left side being close to a wall or some other solid material (such as a long couch) to help your dog understand how to walk backward without swinging his rear end out. You could also practice by facing him and walking forward to encourage your dog to walk backward in a straight line. There are other strategies to teach your dog to back up, and many of them are online. One popular method is to teach your dog to reach back with his rear paws to touch a target behind him. Also, during practice you should vary the number of backward steps for the dog to take, so that your dog doesn't learn to count to "three" and then to stop working and to look for his treat. (Yes, this can and does happen!) The Master class includes three more signs with backward heeling, so, if you plan to enter the Master class, it is important to practice and polish backward heeling.

<u>Heeling with Circles</u>: Halt – Dog Circles Right – Sit (#216). You halt/dog sits. Your dog circles around you to the right, returns to heel position, and sits again.

<u>Sit Stay</u>: The sign for <u>Sit Stay (#298)</u> seems to describe a fairly easy exercise, but there are some possible ways to perform this sign incorrectly. This sign appears AFTER you have passed the Finish sign. Be sure that you pass with <u>the Finish sign on your RIGHT</u> before you proceed to this sign. You will have your dog sit in heel position, facing the direction you will take to get the leash, then you will leave him to get your leash (which has been placed on a ring gate or a chair). Your dog must remain in the sit position while you get the leash and immediately (without waiting for the judge to say anything) return to your dog and <u>WALK BEHIND YOUR DOG</u> to return to heel position. Keep your leash in your hand <u>until</u> the judge says, "Exercise finished." Then you attach the leash to your dog's collar and leave the ring in a controlled manner.

This sign is required in every Excellent course, and does not appear in any other class. It is crucial that you set your dog to sit far enough away from the sign and any other obstacle (such as a ring gate or a wall) to allow you to walk behind him when you return to him without stepping on him or knocking over the sign (each of which could cause you to lose points). And you will lose 10 points if you return directly to him, instead of walking behind him, so REMEMBER to walk behind him! The timer stops the stopwatch when you pass the Finish sign, so TAKE YOUR TIME to perform this sign correctly!

<u>Signs with Turns</u> – These signs involve a "change in direction," where you continue forward in a <u>different</u> direction than before the turn.

- <u>Right Turn</u>: The <u>Stand Right Turn Forward (#214) sign</u> calls for you to stand your dog while you are heeling (without your dog sitting), and then to make a right turn with your dog and continue forward. The dog should MOVE WITH YOU on the turn. Note that this sign calls for a TURN and does not require a pivot, so you may take a step to make this turn.
- <u>Left Turn</u>: The <u>Stand Left Turn Forward (#215) sign</u> calls for you to stand your dog while you are heeling (without your dog sitting), and then to make a left turn with your dog and continue forward. The dog should MOVE WITH YOU on the turn. Note that this sign calls for a TURN and does not require a pivot, so you may take a step to make this turn.

Combination Turns:

- <u>Double Left About Turn (#211)</u>. While heeling, you make a left about turn (where you turn left and your dog moves around you to the right), take two or three steps forward, and complete the left about turn again. You will end up continuing in the same direction as you were before you made the first left about turn.
- <u>About Turn Right About U Turn (#212)</u>. While heeling, <u>you and your dog</u> turn 180 degrees to the right, take two or three steps forward, and then turn 180 degrees to the left. You will end up continuing in the same direction as you were before you made the first about turn right.
- <u>About U Turn About Turn Right (#213)</u>. While heeling, <u>you and your dog</u> turn 180 degrees to the left, take two or three steps forward, and then turn 180 degrees to the right. You will end up continuing in the same direction as you were before you made the first about U turn.

<u>Position Signs</u> – These signs include a change in your dog's position during the exercise. It is important for your dog's body to remain in heel position during each change. For example, if your dog swings his rear end out when he changes from a sit to a stand, you might lose one or more points, depending on how far away his rear end is from you. Some of these signs also include the <u>Call (#299) sign</u> when you leave your dog and walk a short distance away from him. The Call sign will indicate where you should stand after you leave your dog.

- <u>Halt Stand Down (#201).</u> You halt/dog sits. Your dog must stand and then down without you moving your feet or touching your dog. Your dog must remain down until you move forward.
- <u>Halt Stand Sit (#202).</u> You halt/dog sits. Your dog must stand and then sit without you moving your feet or touching your dog. Your dog must remain sitting until you move forward.
- Moving Stand Walk Around (#203). While heeling, you command/signal your dog to stand and stay as you, WITHOUT PAUSING, walk around behind your dog, return to heel position and PAUSE. It is important for you to walk around your dog without stopping or pausing when you command/signal your dog to stand. Be careful that you do not trip over your dog. And remember the PAUSE after the walk-around!
- <u>Moving Down Walk Around (#204).</u> While heeling, you command/signal your dog to down and stay as you, WITHOUT PAUSING, walk around behind your dog, return to heel position and PAUSE. It is important for you to walk around your dog <u>without stopping or pausing</u> when you command/signal your dog to down. Be careful that you do not trip over your dog. And remember the PAUSE after the walk-around!

- <u>Down While Heeling Call to Finish Sit (#206).</u> While heeling, you command/signal your dog to down and stay while you, WITHOUT PAUSING, continue to the Call sign about 6 feet away, and turn to face your dog. Without moving your feet, you may command/signal your dog to finish (either to the right or left) and SIT. It is important for you to continue walking forward without stopping or pausing when you command/signal your dog to down.
- <u>Stand While Heeling Call to Finish Sit (#207).</u> While heeling, you command/signal your dog to stand and stay while you, WITHOUT PAUSING, continue to the Call sign about 6 feet away, and turn to face your dog. Without moving your feet, you may command/signal your dog to finish (either to the right or left) and SIT. It is important for you to continue walking forward without stopping or pausing when you command/signal your dog to stand.
- <u>Stand Leave Sit Call Front Finish Sit (#208).</u> While heeling, you stop and your dog must stand and stay <u>without sitting first</u>. You walk to the Call sign about 6 feet away, and turn to face your dog. You then command/signal your dog to sit, come to front with another sit, and, without moving your feet, finish (<u>either</u> to the right or the left) and sit again. Your dog sits <u>three times</u> in this exercise, but does NOT sit when you stop to stand and leave him.
- <u>Stand Leave Down Call Front Finish Sit (#209).</u> While heeling, you stop and your dog must stand and stay <u>without sitting first</u>. You walk to the Call sign about 6 feet away, and turn to face your dog. You then command/signal your dog to down, come to front with a sit, and, without moving your feet, finish (<u>either</u> to the right or the left) and sit again. Your dog sits <u>two times</u> in this exercise, but does NOT sit when you stop to stand and leave him.

Jump Sign – Send to Jump (#210). This sign differs from the jump sign #103 in the Advanced class in that: (1) you must send your dog to the jump when you reach this sign that is placed 10 feet before the jump, (2) you must walk a path 3 feet away from the jump as you go from this sign toward the jump, and (3) you may <u>not</u> pass the jump until your dog has completed the jump, has returned to you and has moved into heel position (without sitting) by your left side, at which time you and your dog continue on. Your dog MUST clear the jump on the first attempt in the proper direction without stopping.

Important Notes:

- You may NOT repeat this exercise if your dog fails the jump on the first attempt.
- The jump may be a high jump, a bar jump or a broad jump.
- Jump heights are the same in the Excellent class as they are in the Advanced class.
- Two jumps are required in the Excellent class. Sometimes the same jump is used twice, and other times two different jumps are used. If the bar jump is used twice, and if your dog knocks the bar off the uprights on the first jump attempt, be sure to stop and reset the bar on the upright so that your dog may have a chance to complete the jump correctly when you and your dog approach the bar jump for the second time.

GLOBAL RULES TO MEMORIZE FOR ALL CLASSES:

- Whenever you "walk around your dog" or "return to your dog" at a sign, YOU MUST PAUSE before continuing with the course, even though the word "pause" is not included on the sign.
- Also remember the "pause" in the <u>Halt Leave 2 Steps Call to Heel Forward (#118)</u> exercise, where YOU PAUSE before calling your dog to heel after you have taken two steps in front of him.
- You and your dog MUST PIVOT TOGETHER for all signs with the word "pivot!"
- You and your dog MUST MOVE TOGETHER when doing turns and side steps!
- Your dog's leash should ALWAYS be loose, or you might lose points for a tight lead.
- BE COURTEOUS TO ALL. This is a sport we do with our dogs for fun!

GABOC offers AKC Rally run-throughs on most Mondays at 2:00 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. GABOC also offers an AKC S.T.A.R. Puppy class, a CGC/Beginner class and other obedience classes, and a conformation class on most Monday evenings, all as listed on the GABOC website (www.gaboc.org). You are welcome to join GABOC's obedience classes as part of your developing and improving your Rally skills. All of these activities are held at the DuPage County Fairgrounds in Wheaton, Illinois. The website contains more information about the schedule and classes. GABOC would love to have you join us there!



TREASURER'S REPORT

- 1. Donna Eichman reported that there is no simple solution to on-line credit-card payment.
 - Square and PayPal charge 2.9% + \$0.30 (Square) and \$0.31 (PayPal) to pay by invoice.
 - Both charge 3.5% + \$0.15 manual entry (terminal free for both).
 - Invoices would be created to send to those who wanted to pay online. There would be a link that would allow them to pay online.
 - Invoices would have to be created for payment (we would need to create a procedure).
 - Not to be used for Matches.
 - Stripe is more suitable for a store with a terminal
 - Jim will contact PageDesk to inquire what changes would need to be made to our website.
 - Laura Setar is a "web developer" and may be able to make the changes we will need to the site.
 - We will gather more information and discuss further at the next meeting.
- 2. In an effort to add to our income, Donna suggested to invest \$10,000 in a CD for 11 months @ 2.5% at BMO/Harris. In five months, review and decide if we should invest another \$10,000, staggering the mature dates.
- 3. In the past we had a CD @ 5%. The highest rate she found short term is 2.5%.
- 4. Donna Eichman made a motion to open one \$10,000 CD for 11 months and consider opening another in five months. Sandi Stephenson seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- 5. Since the discussion of an audit took place at the April meeting, Julie Sjulie agreed to be on the Audit Committee.
- 6. Karen Heitz made a motion for the Audit Committee to be Julie Sjulie, Lisa Foltz, Laura Setar and Karen Heitz. Sandi Stephenson seconded the motion. Motion carried.
 - The findings of the audit will be reported at the October Membership Meeting.

DIRECTOR OF TRAINING

- 1. Liz Hixon reported:
 - Introductory Manners Class went well. It will now go into its normal rotation with the Puppy Class when we return in August.
 - Draft and Carting Class offered in August. Instructors: Cheri Nicholas, Chuck Holtzen, and Liz Hixon. There will be guest demos, as well.
 - A table person is needed during the month of August.
 - August Rally instruction will use the first 45 minutes to teach the Novice signs. The second 45 minutes will be rally run throughs.
 - We will do this two or three times per year.
 - Liz has printed out copies of the AKC Obedience regulations for UD. She has asked Karen Schlipf and Peggy Covey to do the same for Novice and Open.
 - Liz reported that all classes are going great. She has seen some new instruction methods being started at the different levels.

- 2. Liz requested that Jim purchase 25 AKC Obedience and Rally Books. We will sell them at the club.
- 3. Cheri Nicholas reported that the Manners Class went well. Everything covered was what the handlers wanted, i.e., jumping, pulling, barking. etc.
- 4. Having the table workers uncrated dogs at the sign-in table has become an issue. People signing in aren't paying attention to their leashed dogs. Beginning in August, the following preventive measures will be taken:
 - The sign-in table will be moved to a different location.
 - The sign-in sheet will be redesigned to make it more user friendly. It is too difficult to write with one hand and hold a leash with the other.
 - Suggest to handlers that reactive dog(s) be left in the cars until they have signed in.
- 5. Darlene Barnard made a motion that members working the sign-in table crate their dog. Motion carried. Two members abstained.

MATCHES

- 1. Laura Setar reported the number of entries and our income for matches since 2015:
 - 2018 Total =138 \$674
 - 2017 Total =163 \$769
 - 2016 Total =192 \$809
