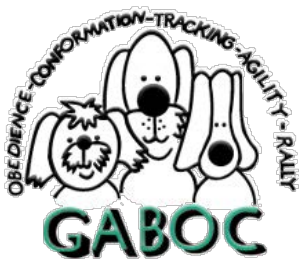

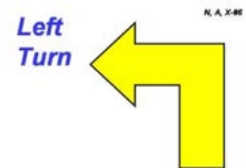
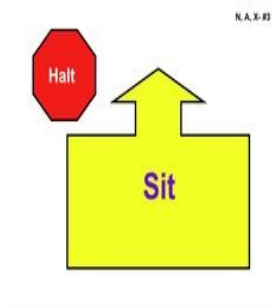
PRESIDENT'S REPORT

While our Monday-night drop-in classes are limited in size, a few handlers are coming to the fairgrounds to resume obedience training and rally and enjoying a good time their dogs. Currently we are in Building #1, a huge building giving everyone plenty of space in which to social distance. The solution is using Glenbard's New Drop in registration online! What a breeze! In minutes I was able to register my dogs and what's more **PLAN MY EVENING!** I am currently working and planning on showing my three dogs in five different levels so quality time in the ring is urgently important! I know when to show up at GABOC, how much time I need in between to prepare the next dog, and when I can tell Shawn I'll be home!!! Instead of arriving early to club to get my name on the board for the early slots and then waiting for my time, **my chosen time and instructor is waiting for me.** What's more, the in and out show and go process is a safe environment.

As a Rally Instructor, I recall a member at a GABOC meeting held at my home voicing strong concerns about being "bumped" by another trainer who took their turn, confusion on who is next, and how this issue needs to be solved. Online registration completely alleviates the frustration this member voiced as students are arriving a few minutes before their time, using their 10 minutes and then exiting. No confusion on who's turn is it next!!! Every participant has private walk time to ask questions on any signs.

In using the system, your information is requested and once that is filled in, it is just a matter of choosing classes and time slots and changing dog information if you have multiple dogs. A reminder can even be sent immediately to your Google calendar and an email confirmation is sent to you. Wonderful! Those of us who have mastered this are happy to help others. Feedback from those students using the system has been excellent and they have voiced their appreciation.

I hope our members will take advantage of this opportunity and spread the word to the training community. I sure wish I could have used this system to help all those at the DMV and prevent waiting in line!

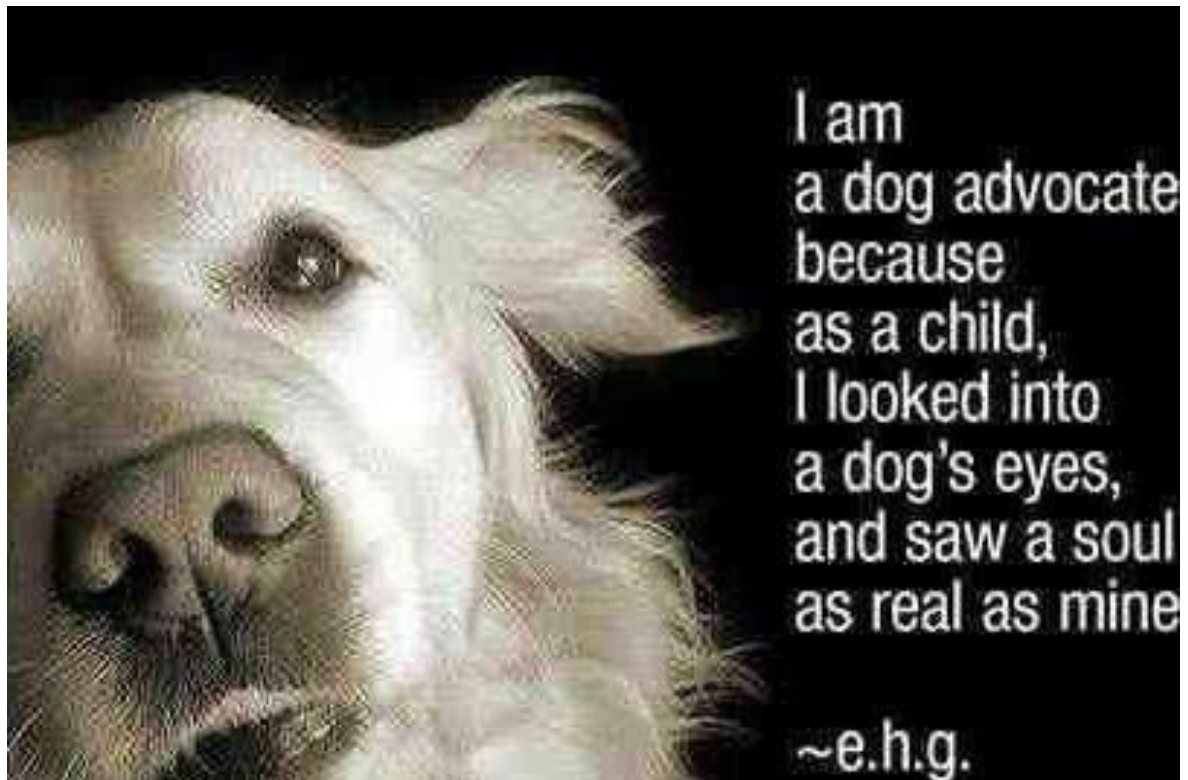
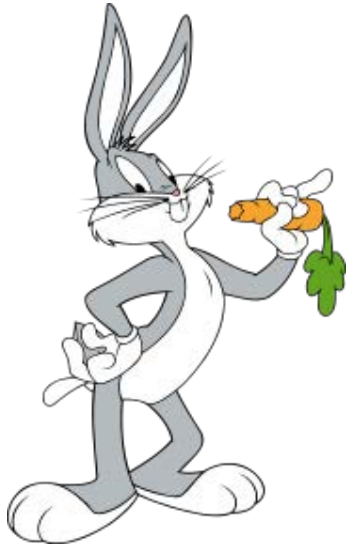

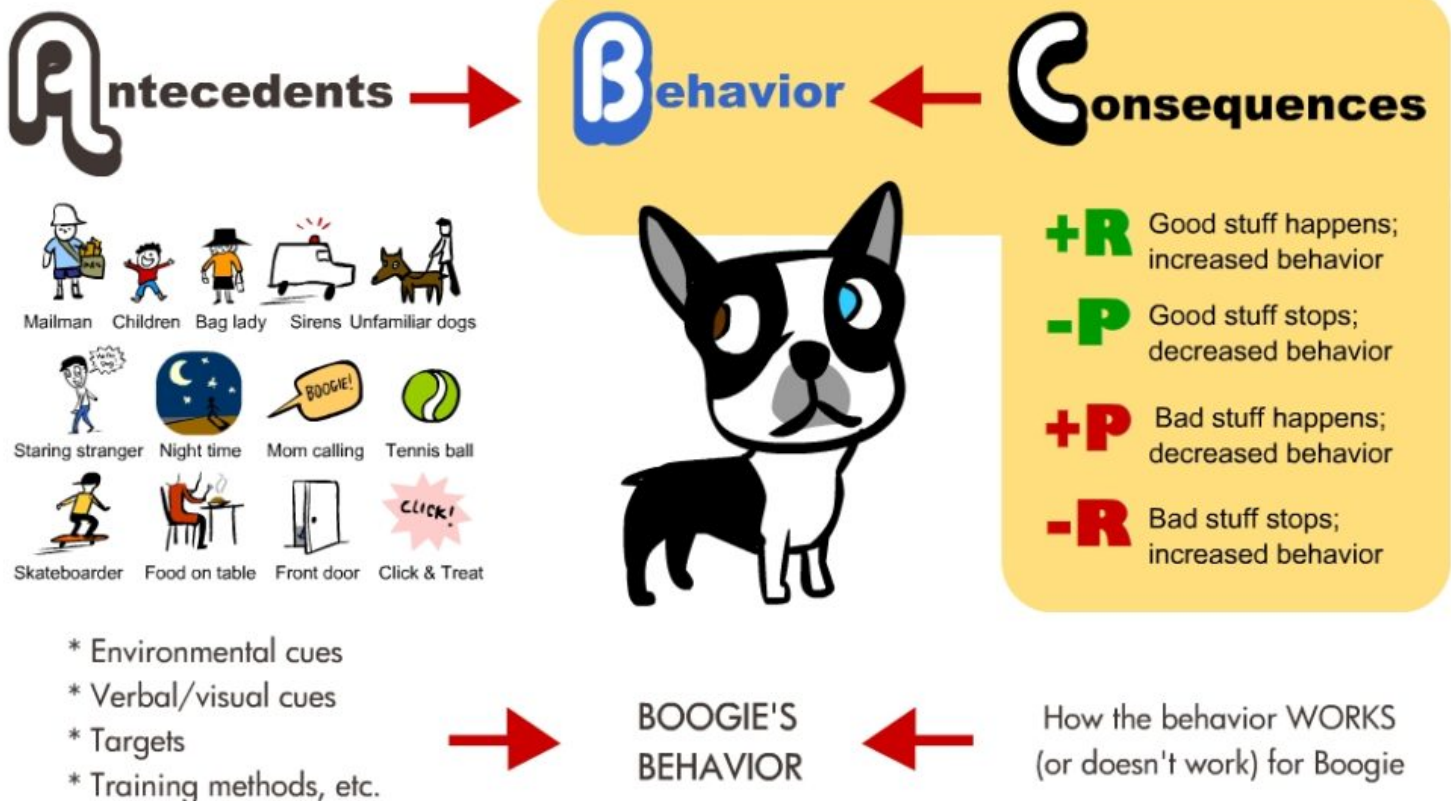

PRE-BOARD MEETING

A pre-board meeting was called to order at 12:57. One application for membership had been submitted for Board approval.

1. Daniel Diss. Daniel Diss currently does not have any dogs but is looking. He is a Confirmation person.

A motion was made by Bob Melka and seconded by Bette McMillan to recommend Daniel Diss for membership. Motion carried.

Pre-board meeting adjourned at 12:58.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The minutes of the February 28 meeting had been sent to the membership via an email blast. As a correction to the minutes, Dean Nicholas's name will be added to those who were present.

A motion was made by Karen Schlipf and seconded by Bob Melka that the minutes be accepted as corrected. Motion carried.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1. Karen Schlipf's name has been submitted by the Board to be elected Vice President.

A motion was made by Bob Melka and seconded by Sheila Gardner that Karen Schlipf be elected Vice President. Motion carried.

2. Jim Clarke thanked Cheri and Dean Nicholas for all of the hard work that they have put forth moving equipment between buildings since the reopening of GABOC.
3. Jim also thanked Chuck Holtzen for setting up Zoom for this particular meeting.

VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

1. Karen Schlipf submitted the name of Daniel Diss for membership.

A motion was made by Sandi Stephenson and seconded by Bette McMillan that Daniel Diss be accepted into membership. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

1. Donna Eichman reported that partial refunds were issued for the Beginner and Puppy classes that had begun in February. And, total refunds were made to those people whose classes had not yet begun.
2. Even though we have taken in money for restarting Puppy, Beginner, and Drop-in training, thus far our net loss for 2020 is \$4,828.36.
3. Part of the \$4,838.36 is payment to Car Dun AI and AKC for the January 20 and 21 Agility Trial and the \$1,000 deposit for our canceled November trial.
5. The question was raised about our rent payments during the shutdown. Jim said we missed 15 Mondays and two Tuesdays at \$417 per day, which equals \$7,089 in payments that were due. To be fair and equitable, we agreed with the fairgrounds to absorb half of this loss so we paid \$3,544.50 in rent for that time. That figure is also part of the \$4,828.36 loss previously mentioned.
6. Since we have resumed training, we are paying our contracted fees.

DIRECTOR OF TRAINING

1. Joan Mazat read Liz Hixon's Director of Training Report:
In her written report, Liz proposed that all classes, including drop-in, must pay on line.
*See Liz Hixon's complete report on page 5.

In Liz's absence, Joan Mazat made a motion that all classes, including drop-in must pay online. Laura Setar seconded the motion. Motion defeated: 8 were in favor of drop-in people paying online, 10 were against paying online, 1 abstain.

REGISTRAR

Chuck Holtzen submitted her report on 9/19/20 via email:

Registration opened July 6, 2020

All 4 Puppy Classes were filled within 12 days. I did end up having to move someone to the next session as her dog had parasites so she is registered in the next session starting in Oct.

We filled 2 Beginner Classes by Aug 3, with the 3rd class being partially full. During online registration for Puppy & Beginner classes, all but 1 person was cooperative with the new procedures and requirements for submitting forms. And unfortunately that was a Board member.

The online registration for Drop-in Classes has been set up and Liz & I are working on tweaking it as needed. There have been about 6 people total signing up for Drop-In Classes each week. They don't all show up each week either. This is very good reason as to why we should have online payment for Drop in Classes so we are not losing money for spots reserved and not used.

The whole process because of the times we live in has been a learning experience. I am most appreciative of the support I have received from Liz Hixon and Cheri Nicholas. The amount of frustration and stress I had to work through with the other Board Members is beyond explanation. This job has grown into a position that is about equal to hours spent on a part time job.
Post Meeting Notes:

The attendance subject regarding online registration as being a reason people are not signing up for Drop in Classes is ridiculous argument. We didn't have

any more people pre-covid taking classes than we have signing up online now. We are starting to fill Rally which has been our biggest draw since classes resumed. So the people that are supposedly not signing up online, where were they before because they weren't coming to train before you had to sign up online.

3. We do have judges for our 2021 trial. Danna Eichman suggested that we establish a Judges Committee to secure judges for the 2022 trial due to the fact that she will not be returning as Trial Chairman. Sandi Stephenson, Laura Setar, and Joan Mazat volunteered to be on that committee.

BRAGS

1. Bette McMillan and Chip, Sheltie, earned his CGC on August 28.
2. Bob Melka and Hidee, Golden Retriever, earned her Master Agility Title (MX) at Car Dun AI on 9/11 and her Bronze Master Agility Jumpers Title at Car Dun AI also on 9/11.

OLD BUSINESS

NEW BUSINESS

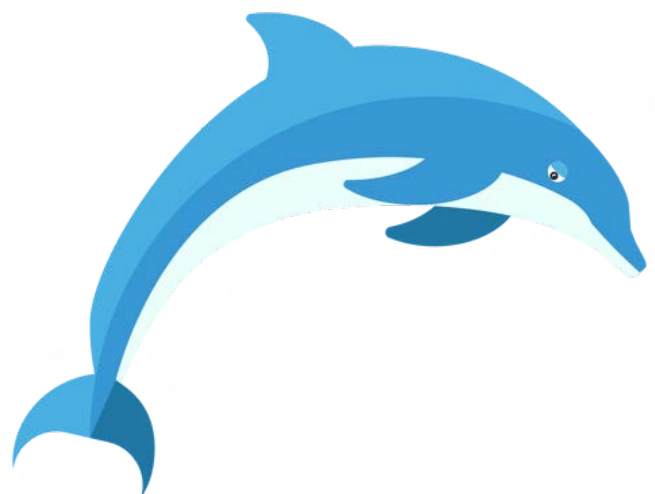

***GABOC Director of Training report for September 2020**

With training having restarted on August 3rd, there were many preparations that had to be done in order to make classes run smoothly and keep everyone safe in the process with COVID19.

I'm sure we can all agree that this COVID19 pandemic SUCKS!!!

Chuck, Cheri, and I have all worked hard in getting this off the ground and running pretty smoothly. The instructors that we have in place are all doing a great job. The people working the door have been great! Thank you to Karen, Gail and Donna that stepped up when I needed help at the door.

There will be some tweaks along the way as we find what works and what does not.

For things to run smoothly, we need the cooperation of everyone. So, if you are not teaching, training, or working at the door, you are not allowed in the building! No extra bodies allowed! And if you are doing one of those 3 things, you MUST have a signed Disclaimer on file. No exceptions!

The online registration has taken a lot of time and effort to get it all functioning. But there is one thing that needs to be changed. I recommended this at the meeting in June and it was decided not to go ahead with it, but it needs to happen now.

We have all the classes now with online registration, we need to have ALL CLASSES PAY ONLINE AS WELL! It makes no sense to have everyone register online, not have any paper handouts at the club and then take paper money at the door! That is putting people at risk unnecessarily. We need to have NO PAPER exchange hands, including cash! This virus is not going away any time soon, we need to change our ways. Things will NEVER be the way they were, EVER.

We have had students ask why they cannot pay online for drop-in classes. They register online and then look for where they can pay online. We have the capabilities to do it. There are even packages that Chuck and I were working on where a student can sign up for 4 weeks and their 5th is free. This will encourage people to come and to sign up for more than one class at a time. We set one price for all people for all drop-in classes, no more senior discount. One price across the board. We are the cheapest club around and with our funds being so low this year, to charge so little and then give a senior discount on top of that, it's crazy! I recommend one set price, be it \$8 minimum or \$10. With online payment you cannot have multiple prices, you have one set price. Keep it simple. So, let's start with \$8 now and we can raise it next year to \$9 or 10. If we're going to survive, we have to make some major changes.

Chuck and I figured out how we could set up the online registration so people can sign up for multiple weeks ahead and it would not have to be set up new every week. We knew there had to be an easier way to do it and with a little looking and playing with it, we figured it out.

There would be no refunds if you paid online for drop in and then did not show up, you lose your money, sorry. There will be a notice on the website that will warn you about this. Do not sign up for weeks unless you're sure you will make it to class. Paying online will encourage their attendance as there are no refunds.

The funds are directly deposited into our bank account eliminating the need for manual deposits to be made. Reports can be retrieved easily from Wix and Square to balance to. All data is available. Chuck and I have looked at the reports and they are easy to get to. I STRONGLY urge the club and the board to go to online payment ASAP!

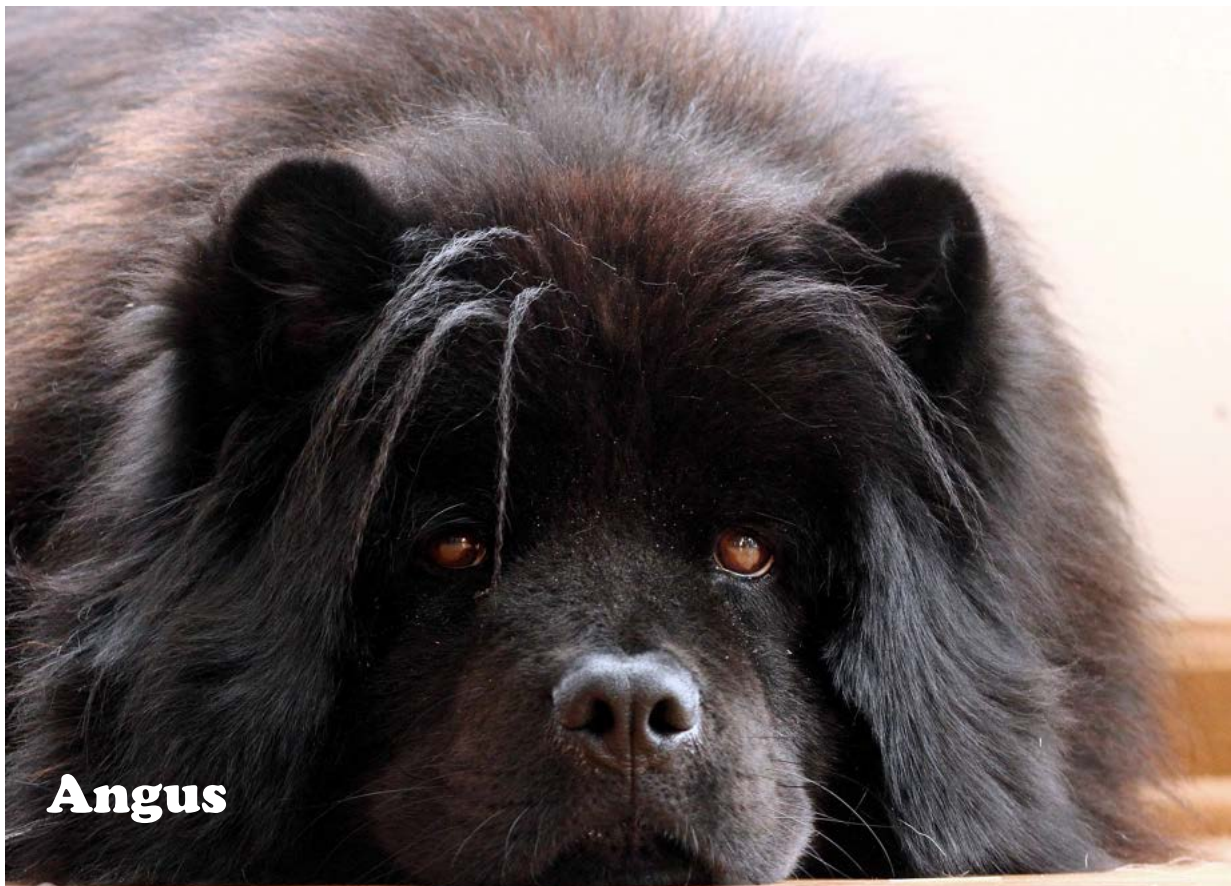

Post meeting notes....

First, I am very disappointed that the online payment was voted on before I was able to join the meeting. **My report was NOT A MOTION!! I DID NOT MAKE A MOTION WITHIN MY REPORT!** It was a recommendation that required a discussion that should have taken place after I joined the meeting. I believe students should have the option to pay online if they choose to. Just like you amended the online registration to allow walk-ins (more on that below), I think you could have done the same for the payment. But I did not get to even discuss it before you voted on it!

Regarding the Online registration and the changes that were made at the meeting. The members that were there voted to allow walk-in students in addition to the online registration for the drop-in classes. There are several problems with this. Since people that have registered online have preference over the people that just show up at the door. Someone could come after driving say 30 minutes or so and then get turned away at the door because the class is full.

We didn't have any more people before covid than we do now in our drop-in classes. We didn't even give it a chance yet!!

Right now, the Novice class and the Open class, are just that a class with a limit of 6 students. The walk-ins will not be a problem for that unless it fills up because it has a start time and an ending time.

For Rally and Utility, walk-ins will be a problem. There are 10-minute timeslots for Rally, and 15-minute timeslots for Utility, people sign up for a time slot, they arrive no more than 5 minutes before their time and after their done, they leave. They know when to show up and they know when they will be done. They can schedule their lives around it. They like that. If we have walk-ins, they will not know when to show up as they will not know what times are available. They will then either be waiting around outside of the building (because they cannot wait inside) until there is an available spot, or they will be discouraged and leave.

Before covid, the one major complaint with the rally students what they had to get there early so they could sign up on the board, but then they had to wait around for their turn. They hated the waiting around!

The online registration eliminates that waiting around! You run the course twice during your ten minutes and then you are done, and you can go home!

If there are people that are having trouble signing up online, they can contact Chuck or myself and we can walk them through the process, it is really very easy, even for those technically challenged. And when you sign up for multiple weeks your information stays in there as you go, you don't have to keep inputting the same info. Easy-peasy!

B.A.T. EXERCISE

STEP 1: Stop when DOG is at a safe distance, sub-threshold

STEP 2: Wait for a peaceful or good choice and mark it.

Step 3: Functional Reward = DISTANCE

LEAD HIM
AWAY



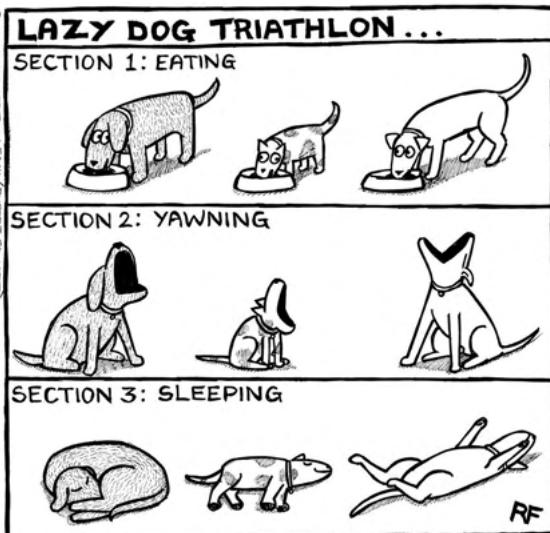
Step 4: Optional/Bonus Reward = TREAT!

*The treat comes AFTER the functional reward



RINSE, REPEAT...or Leave in opposite direction.

The MORE OFTEN that our dog is rewarded for NON-AGGRESSIVE behavior, he will learn that he doesn't need to react aggressively when something stresses him out. Ideally, we want him to respond with natural doggie calming signals, even when there is no human and leash around.

Take a Walk by Windy and Joan

Walking the dog.... easy enough to say but sometimes a challenge even for our talented obedience dogs. Sometimes the great outdoors do not translate the same in their view. Wonderful temperaments at club are not always evident on the street, especially in the face of poorly socialized dogs that may tend to be more aggressive or people who don't know how to deal with the situation. And of course there is the issue of territory- clear to canines but not so much to us!!!

Such can be the case of my sweetie, Windy. My Darling started off so awesome on a walk, riding on skate boards when she was a pup

to dispel all those bugaboos that dogs don't like and seeing all sorts of dogs that she did not care about. But a round of blastomycosis and a subsequent injury due to being weakened kept her indoors during a key time in her growing up and set her back a little bit. COVID then has seen us ALL walking like maniacs and she saw lots of dogs she had never met. Not a pretty picture- an angry Rottie passing other dogs. What do to? Make me and her more important than the challenge she perceived.

How? Find what she really likes. In this case, a Kong Squeaky Tennis Ball. We see another dog coming our way and I say BALL! She immediately takes the ball and we pass by as she trots along with the reward no other dog has, including her pack buddies Mars and Blue. She feels special and gets smiles from people – win win! Particular dogs she can see first and looks up expecting her ball before I offer. Love it

Another method is “touch”. Touch to Windy is get a treat by touching my hand. We also have a packet of good treats along and if we are passing others and I would like her attention- “Touch Touch” and again her focus is on goodies from me and not others. The trick is timing- the “touch” comes BEFORE any negative behavior so the good is rewarded only.

Another word we use is “walk on”. Once we pass another dog and person, sometimes she would like to dwell on the situation. I tell them to “walk on” and that means, we are moving forward, walking on.

When we are on our way, again, she is rewarded for being a good girl.

I hope everyone gets their early morning walk to start their days off right for themselves and their companion!!!
